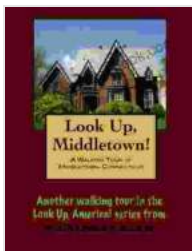

Leg 1: Wesleyan University

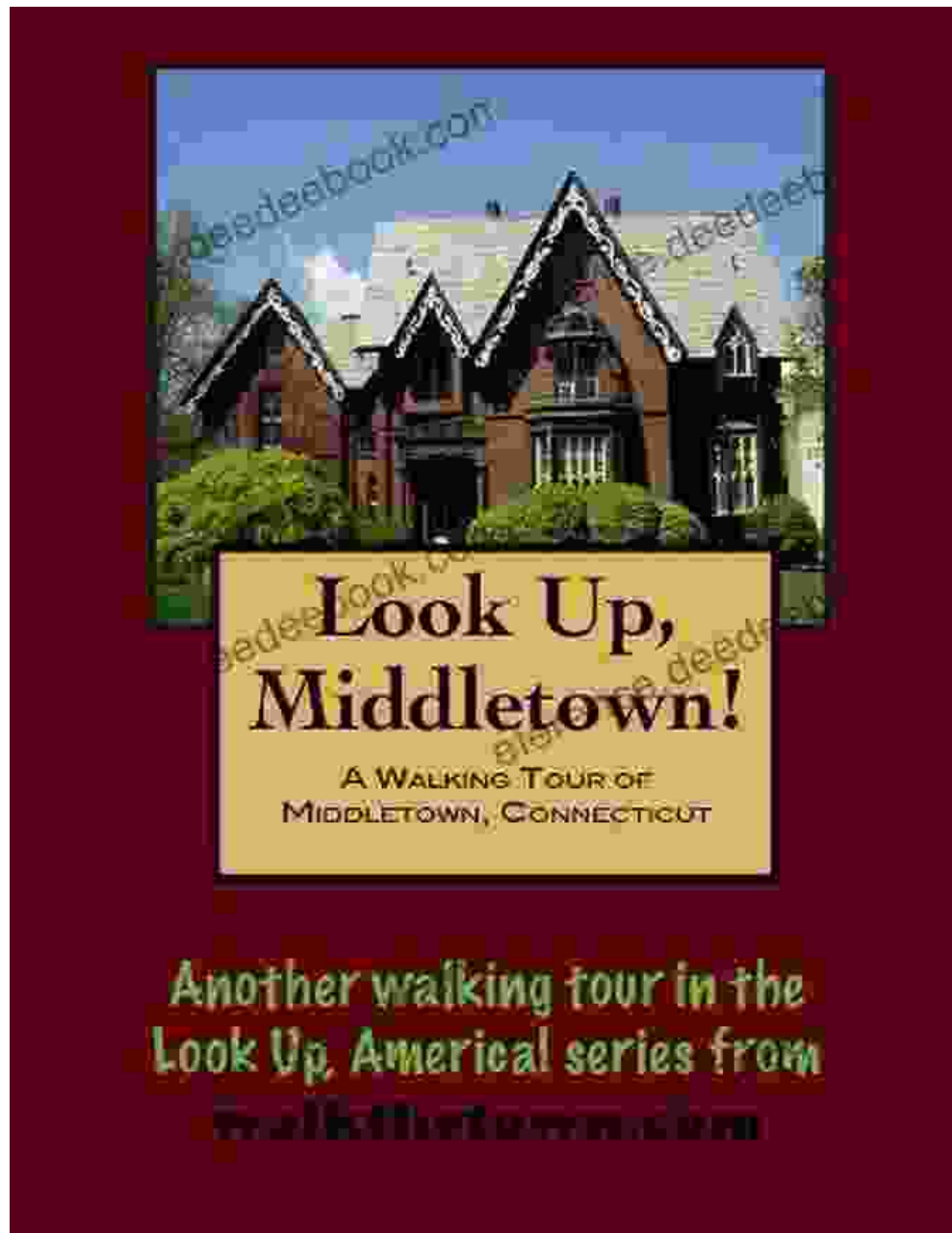
